In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I (we) agree to abide by the rules and regulations of The American Kennel Club in effect at the time of this event, and any additional rules and regulations appearing in the premium list of this event and entry form and any decision made in accord with them. I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim of loss, injury or damage to this dog.

Dogs may enter either the Novice "A" class or the Novice "B" class—not both. To be eligible for High in Trial award you must be entered in all elements for this trial.

The A/B Sections: The Novice A class is for beginners. The exhibitor is fully responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es)/divisions. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of qualifying scores.

Move-ups will be offered. All requests must be made prior to the Handler's Briefing for that Trial

ENTRY METHOD—First Received Entries

ENTRIES WILL OPEN Wednesday, 3/11/2020 10:00am CDT at the Trial Secretary's address. All mailed entries received before 3/11/2020 will be returned. Overnight or certified mail must be sent with the "No Signature Required" waiver signed. Entries are accepted in order of receipt by post mark. The Trial Secretary will make the final determination to fairly and equitably determine which entries were received first.

MAIL IN ENTRIES must be <u>received</u> by Wednesday, 4/22/2020 10:00am CDT. After which time entries cannot be accepted, cancelled, altered, or substituted except as provided for in Chapter 11, Section 6 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows. Entries received prior to the opening date shall be treated as an invalid entry and shall be returned to the sender.

WAIT-LIST INFORMATION

OCOTC is not offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor.

Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, the dog displays no sign of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Deaf and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Females in season may not participate. Aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from an injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance may not participate. No dog shall compete if it is sutured, bandaged, or has any visible wounds.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5. Section 26 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area". This includes essential oils.

Spectator Area. Spectators are encouraged. Any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of Handler Discrimination classes. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be ask to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search with handlers who have not run.

Crating space will be available in a building. Crates may be left overnight.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

Trial Site. It is not appropriate to visit the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

HANDLER DISCRIMINATION

Handler Discrimination classes are titling classes in which the targeted scent is that of the handler themselves. Handlers are required to provide their own scented articles in a plastic bag, for the Novice class, one cotton glove or cotton sock. Three qualifying scores are required to earn titles in each class. Handlers may utilize any method they feel is best to scent their article. Suggestions include rubbing the article on the handler's body or storing the article in dirty laundry.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

The **Staging Area** will be out of view of search area(s). The Staging Area will include crating, warmup and waiting areas, as well as the Secretary's table for check-ins and posting of running order and results. The **Handler's Briefing** will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there is an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. NO DOGS are to be present during the Handler's Briefing.

A warm-up area will be available consisting of ONE container of each odor being tested at the trial and may also consist of blank containers. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the handler-dog team prior their run. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

SEARCH AREA AND RING CONDITIONS

Search areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the Regulations for each class.

Search Area Conditions. Searches may be indoors, on matted, concrete, carpeted, or tiled surfaces, or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt surfaces.

Search Area Sizes will be as follows, Container Novice (250-400sqft), Container Advanced (400-600sqft), Container Excellent & Master (600-800sqft), Interior Novice (100-200sqft), Interior Advanced (200-400sqft), Interior Excellent (2-areas, 400-800sqft total), Interior Master (2-3areas, 600-1000sqft total), Exterior Novice (200-400sqft), Exterior Advanced (400-800sqft), Exterior Excellent (800-1500sqft), Exterior Master (1500-2000sqft), Buried Novice & Advanced (150-200sqft), Buried Excellent (200-300sqft), Buried Master (300-400sqft), Handler Discrimination Novice (250-400sqft), Handler Discrimination Advanced (150-400sqft), Handler Discrimination Excellent (400-600sqft), Handler Discrimination Master (2-3Areas, 300-800sqft total), Detective (2000-5000sqft total).

AWARDS

Placement ribbons will be awarded in each class as follows:

First Place......Blue
Second Place......Yellow
Fourth Place......White
Qualifying Score.....Dark Green

A **New Title** rosette will be awarded to all dog/handler teams finishing a title

High in Trial

Only teams who participate in all elements offered (Container, Interior, Exterior, and Buried), and qualify in each, are eligible to win **High in Trial**. One High in Trial winner is chosen for each level offered.

The High in Trial is determined by adding the team's faults across the elements. If there is a tie based on faults, then the team's times across the elements will be summed and the faster-finishing team will win.

Teams winning High in Trial will earn a special trial rosette.

Award for Junior Qualifier

Handlers, under 18 years, will receive a special award for their dog earning a qualifying score in the Trial.

Award for Specially-Enabled Dogs

Teams, where the dog has physical challenges (Chapter 2, Section 3) will receive a special award for their dog earning a qualifying score in the Trial.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the Trial Secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY: The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. OCOTC and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. OCOTC reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against OCOTC or any official thereof.

COLLARS, LEASHES AND HARNASSES: During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN: At check-in, you will receive your armband number and an event catalog. Once the time and location for check-in is determined all exhibitors will be notified by email. **Exhibitors MUST check-in EACH day they are entered.**

RINGSIDE: Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public-address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. If, in the Judge's opinion, the exhibitor or their dog smells of a target odor, at the Judge's discretion, a Team may be dismissed from competition.

CLAIMS will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.
